Hello, everyone. I've got a few quick announcements for you.

1) All our RockSim 4.0 data is now available on our main website at www.publicmissiles.com. The data there is everything we used to have on our Annex Site, all rolled together, including the re-released Miranda, Tethys and Explorer kits. We don't yet have QT airframe tubing in the database, but the weights are very similar to the phenolic tubes and build differences from flyer to flyer will be different enough that the weight difference of the QT in the RockSim kits really won't matter anyway.

2) We have a newer FAQ on the website. We've rearranged the information in it to hopefully lay out a little better/more sensibly, and have added information on QT, motor retention, and a few other things, along with "onesy-twosy" improvements here and there.

3) We now have 11.4" to 75mm 1/2" thick birch ply centering rings. They are part number CR-92, and are \$9.00 each. They are available on the webstore and of course by calling direct or ordering through your dealer.

4) We have made some chute changes both to have them be more consistent in size from chute-to-chute in the same size, and also to make them all more consistent overall. All our chutes are now sold in sizes of 6" and 12" increments. Chutes up and including 54" are 8-panel; 60" and larger are 10-panel. The size changes will not make an appreciable difference in use, they're just easier to hold "to spec" in manufacturing. The sizes changed were:

(Old size, New size)

34", 36"

44, 48

62, 60

Remember, there's plenty of PML kits out there in the dealer body that already have the original size chutes in them, so don't be surprised if you buy a kit and it's got a 44" instead of a 48". Again, there is no appreciable difference in use: as far as we're concerned with 'em, the 44 and the 48 are "the same thing" in terms of usability for a certain kit.

5) The last change to tell you about is related to the chute sizing. We have a new Kit Specs sheet on the site with updated chute sizes for the appropriate kits. For example, a Pterodactyl Jr. used to come with a 34" chute (as the spec sheet said), but now it comes with a 36", and the Kit Specs sheet reflects that change.

That's it for now. Hope your flying season is going well, and thanks again for your interest and support of PML. We truly appreciate it!!
